

Two-week Outlook Effective May 9, 2022

The Central Avenue Improvements Project Team will provide this progress report every other week so that you can stay up-to-date on what's happening in the project area and what could impact your travel in and around the area. Please feel free to share this information with your customers, clients, neighbors, and friends.

Please note: Pedestrian access will be maintained for all participating in the annual Women's Wine and Chocolate Walk on Saturday, May 14.

Scheduled Work (Weather Permitting)

- Install new water service from Curtis to Clinton Street
- Install storm sewer at Leibee Street and finish installing catch basins for surface water runoff from Leibee to Baltimore Street
- Install electrical conduit across intersections at Charles, Grimes, Leibee, Garfield and Baltimore Streets
- Install drains at edge of pavement to keep water off roadway from Charles to Grimes Street, then from Clark Street moving west
- Remove curb and part of sidewalk from Garfield to Baltimore Street
- Remove old storm pipe from Charles to Baltimore Street
- Remove pavement from Charles to Grimes Street
- Duke to install gas line from Clark to Clinton Street, then to Verity Parkway
- Resurface six public parking lots and alleys in the Central Avenue blocks of 1100, 1200 and 1300 by City Street Maintenance crew

Completed Work

- Installed storm sewer manholes and storm sewer east of Baltimore Street
- Completed video recording in sewer line to prepare for lining of pipe
- Installed new catch basins near Leibee Street
- Duke installed gas line from Grimes to east of Curtis Street

Impacts To Travel



- LOCAL access is OPEN for businesses and residents from Charles to Grimes Street and Clark Street to Verity Parkway (now through May 20).
- NO THROUGH TRAFFIC is permitted from Charles Street to Verity Parkway (now until June 28).
- Central Avenue from Grimes to Clark Street is CLOSED TO ALL TRAFFIC.
- Pedestrian access is OPEN throughout the project area.

The Central Avenue Improvements Project will make a generational transformation in the city's historic downtown district by revitalizing a key section of Central Avenue within the city's urban core. The project will modernize outdated infrastructure that will help attract and retain businesses and benefit residents and visitors of the downtown area for years to come.
